Costs were higher than expected, but finished with \$5000 surplus. Will need to plan carefully in 2024. Much depends again on the status of 950 Kings. David extended the Board's thanks to Kelly and the committee for their excellent work.

 - Indigenization of Practice plans are being developed
 - Programs have until mid-June to submit their plans
 - Summer Camp 2023
 - It's been a roller coaster ride with the application accidentally being diverted and funding delayed by several weeks
 - On track now, hiring in progress
 - Multiple grants were secured to provide as many spots as possible
 - Capacity Enhancement Grant (Federal Community Recovery Grant)
 - Received full funding of just under \$20,000

- Funds will cover new hybrid meeting technology (OWL system), accounting technology upgrades, translation of key documents, improvements of online content for potential donors.
