- Seniors Entitlement Service
 - New agreement with Victoria Immigrant and Refugee Centre (VIRCs) to provide service to seniors not born in Canada Comes with \$10,000 in funding
- Housing Outreach
 - City of Victoria approved year-two funding of \$45,000
 - Complements \$30,000 from Victoria Foundation
 - 35 hours weekly of housing outreach support
- Neighbourhood Small Grants

 Funds being distributed and some projects are underway
 Fall application period is still open
 Now includes a stipend for the organizer
- Youth Programs
 - Fun, busy summer: Out Trip Mondays, Art in the Park Tuesdays, Beach Wednesdays. The Crew hosted a movie night in the Gym, will help with Halloween Carnival. Food Skills for Youth is popular and over capacity.
